



Suitability analysis for new parks in White Rock, BC

The City of White rock expects enough population growth in the coming years that it will require new park space. This land must be acquired from existing parcel(s), and the site must meet certain criteria to be suitable for a park. The above maps show suitability analyses for two types of parks: playground parks and natural area parks. They each have different criteria, such as needing to be far away from existing parks or proximity to other community facilities like childcare centres. Notably, the second map aims to find a site on Environmentally Sensitive Areas (ESAs) or Environmental Development Permit Areas (EDPAs). Only one site fit all the criteria for this second analysis. For the first analysis for playground parks, several sites were identified, all near one of the two childcare facilities mapped.
